

GRANDMA'S TIMELINE

Exploring Granny's Glory Box containing memorabilia from the 90 years of her life

Students will explore the contents of this box in small groups and activities to identify how the past is measured.

Students will make links to the present through past places, people and things.

Four rotational stations are set up where students explore areas of entertainment, work and hardship from this period in time.

Artefacts and clothing from the WA Army Museum are presented for students to try on and handle, along with material excavated from local sites.



Target audience:

Primary school students, pre-primary to Year 4

Study area: Social history

Duration: 3 hours

Numbers: Maximum of 65 students

Skills developed:

- To order both familiar and non-familiar objects and events in a time sequence
- To be able to use the language to describe the passing of time
- To use clues to suggest the age of an object on its timeline
- To ask and answer questions about the past
- To retell a narrative from objects of the past

Workshop outcomes:

- Ability to order familiar objects and events in a time sequence
- Ability to understand the concept of the passing of time and how each story is individual with some common elements
