

## THE FIRST INHABITANTS

What do we need to survive?

**Glimpse a snapshot of the diversity of the ways of life, beliefs and practices of the traditional owners of the south west of Western Australia.**

These include the 14 tribes that make up the Nyungar nation.

Our studies begin with the earliest archaeological habitation sites in the south-west.



**Target audience:**

Primary school students, pre-primary to Year 4

**Study area:** Indigenous

**Duration:** 2 hours

**Numbers:** Maximum of 60 students

**Skills developed:**

- To identify how the past is recorded and remembered
- To compare the similarities and differences of Nyungar groups themselves through objects
- To use the language of time

**Workshop outcomes:**

- Understand the significance of local places and their link to the past
- Acquire knowledge of some of the life practices of the traditional owners
- Draw comparisons and make connections between past and present societies

**Cost:**

- \$300 flat rate
- Add \$7 per head over 43 students, up to a maximum of 60 participants
